

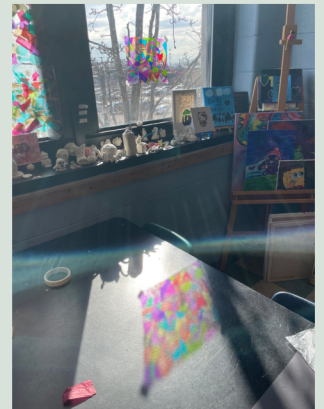

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Stained Glass

Students will crinkle their white sheet of paper, trace the creases, trace those lines onto the clear paper then color in the shapes with paint markers.
